A. Abusanele (Pty) Ltd-Enviroserv is hereby permitted in terms of Section 25/1 of the eThekweni Municipality Sewage Disposal Bylaws to deliver treated contaminated storm water from Enviroserv Waste Management (Pty) Ltd to the Southern Waste Water Treatment Works tanker trade effluent facility.

REGULATIONS FOR ROAD HAULAGE OPERATORS

1. No haulage operator is to enter the council premises without the required documentation concerning the Sewage (and including trade effluent) for disposal.
2. Effluent generators will be held responsible for the cost of any accidental damages caused by their subcontracted haulers to Council roadways, structures or other Council assets at effluent discharge facilities operated by the council. Haulage Operators who are involved in accidents or who cause damage to Council roadways and /or Council structures while present at Council facilities may not leave such facility until the necessary reporting procedures have been carried out. Such procedures include:
 - a) The Haulage Operator must notify the facility's superintendent or senior operator of the incident.
 - b) The Haulage Operator will be asked to make a statement describing the incident and will be asked to sign a statement. An incident report will be completed by Council for cost recovery purposes.
3. Road Haulage vehicles must give way to pedestrians, as well as council vehicles such as tractors and mowers involved in council works operation and maintenance.
4. Maximum speed limit is 20km per hour.
5. Speed must be reduced when approaching and negotiating bends in the road.
6. Where two haulage vehicles approach a bend from opposite directions the unladed haulage vehicle must pull to one side and stop, allowing the laden haulage vehicle right of way.
7. The Hauliers section 12.(1) permit holder and where trade effluent is disposed the section 25.(1) permit holder are both required to report to the Pollution Division at agreed frequency on compliance with the Regulations for Haulage Operators within council facilities and include in the report inter alia, audit checks, non-compliance , driver training and remediation measures.

- Discharge of tankered effluents may be temporarily suspended or delayed due to rain conditions.
 - Discharge hours may be reviewed from time to time.
9. Haulage operators and for tankered trade effluent the section 25.(1) permit holder, must have emergency containment and reporting procedures for both minor and major spills. These procedures to include liaison and reporting to council staff.
 10. The permit holder shall develop and implement a waste accounting system that details the name of source, date and the time it was removed and the place of final disposal. This waste accounting system shall be kept in the company premises for reconciliation by the authorized officer
 11. Should the company discharge illegally, the company will be charged a maximum number of loads permitted for a month as a penalty.
 12. The permitted holder shall ensure that the account is not more than sixty day in arrears, failing which the permit will be suspended or withdrawn.
 13. Company to adhere to all eThekweni Municipal Bylaws, including the Town Planning Bylaw which does not permit tankers to park overnight in residential areas.

14. If the company is permitted to discharge Domestic effluent and it is found to be discharging anything other than domestic effluent, the permit will be suspended or withdrawn. And on renewal of the permit, the company will only be permitted to discharge at the Southern Wastewater Treatment Works.
15. Domestic Effluent must be screened in the suction pipe before entering the Tanker, so as to prevent any foreign objects (e.g. stone, sand, cloths, etc.) entering the Tanker.
16. All Tankers should be fitted with a tracking device; records should be made available to eThekweni Municipality on request.
17. All slips should be submitted to the shift assist on duty at the tanker bay, including cancelled or damaged slips. If the slip is damaged or cancelled and not submitted, it will be regarded as a missing slip.
